Individual, group, and family therapy for youth and adults in your home, school, or community setting. Office-based and telehealth options also available.

ages 3+

Case Management ages 3–22

Community-based case management is supporting youth and their families in navigating behavioral concerns. Helping develop and implement effective strategies and coping skills to enhance daily life. Additionally, connecting families with valuable community resources.

Care Navigation ages 3-

Care Navigators will be the personal point of contact to manage personalized treatment in efforts to increase individual progress and outcomes.

Transition to Independence ages 14–22

(Butler County ages 14–24)

Intensive community-based (outpatient) services focusing on a successful transition into adulthood.

OhioRISE Care Coordination ages 0–20

The OhioRISE Plan is a single, statewide health plan responsible for providing, managing, and coordinating behavioral health care for children eligible for the OhioRISE Program. OhioRISE offers a "one stop shop" approach to providing care by pairing eligible youth with wraparound Care Coordination and new services, resulting in a simpler but richer service experience.
