Enjoy this comprehensive guide as you begin your journey of opening your home to youth in need.

### 1. Instant Family (2018) | Movie | PG-13 | 118 min

*Why:* The most accessible foster-care recruitment film shows chaos, humor, disruption, and growth without sugarcoating.

### 2. Foster (2018, HBO) | Documentary | TV-14 | 90 min

*Why:* Gold standard for realism. Youth voice, caseworkers, courts, foster parents — all present.

### 3. Short Term 12 (2013) | Movie | R | 96 min

*Why:* Best depiction of trauma-informed care and secondary trauma for staff. Excellent for professional training.

### 4. The Fosters (2013–2018) | TV Series | TV-14 | 5 seasons

*Why:* Long-form exploration of placements, reunification, adoption, identity, and system strain.

### 5. The Great Gilly Hopkins (2015) | Movie | PG-13 | 94 min

*Why:* Strong foster-youth perspective; good bridge between youth and adult audiences.

### 6. Anne with an E (2017–2019) | TV Series | TV-14 | 3 seasons

*Why:* Trauma, attachment, and belonging are portrayed gently but honestly.

### 7. Sound of Hope: The Story of Possum Trot (2024) | Movie | PG-13 | ~120 min

*Why:* Shows large-scale foster/adoptive response while inviting discussion about capacity and sustainability.

### 8. Lilo & Stitch (2002) | Animated Movie | PG | 85 min


*Why:* Excellent kinship-care story for younger children; social worker presence handled respectfully.

### 9. Rocket's Island (2012–2015, UK) | TV Series | TV-G | 3 seasons

*Why:* Rare example of calm, stable foster care shown as a long-term environment, not a crisis.

### 10. Matilda (1996) | Movie | PG | 98 min

*Why:* A child-friendly story about neglect, rescue, and chosen family — timeless and discussion-friendly.



### Books for Teens & Adults: Foster Care, Adoption, and Found Families

#### Realistic/Contemporary (Not All Heavy)


1. *Three Little Words* by Ashley Rhodes-Courter  
*An honest but accessible memoir, often recommended for foster parents.*
2. *Another Place at the Table* by Kathy Harrison  
*Reflective foster parent perspective that is humane, but not preachy.*
3. *Orphan Train* by Christina Baker Kline  
*A historical fiction work about displacement, resilience, and kinship across generations.*
4. *Before We Were Yours* by Lisa Wingate  
*A historical tale about a found family and child welfare abuses that is emotional but readable.*
5. *White Oleander* by Janet Fitch  
*About fictional foster placements from a strong teen perspective.*

#### Fantasy/Science-Fiction/Speculative (Found Family Themes)

1. *The House in the Cerulean Sea* by T.J. Klune  
*Highly recommended! A bureaucracy satire about a magical foster home that is very joy-forward.*
2. *The Graveyard Book* by Neil Gaiman  
*A story about an orphan raised by ghosts that is gentle, eerie, and deeply about chosen family.*
3. *Good Omens* by Pratchett & Gaiman  
*This is not foster-specific, but it is very resonant and about a found family through chaos.*
4. *The Long Way to a Small, Angry Planet* by Becky Chambers  
*This is excellent for youth who don't want "issue books" and features a crew-as-family dynamic.*
5. *Ender's Game* by Orson Scott Card  
*A story about institutional care, isolation, and moral injury that often resonates with foster teens.*

#### Young Adult/Crossover Fiction

1. *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time* by Mark Haddon  
*Features caregiver breakdowns, system strain, and independence.*
2. *The Perks of Being a Wallflower* by Stephen Chbosky  
*Features trauma, healing, and chosen support networks.*
3. *The Ocean at the End of the Lane* by Neil Gaiman  
*Features childhood neglect, magical protection, and emotional safety.*
4. *Eleanor Oliphant Is Completely Fine* by Gail Honeyman  
*Features an adult survivor finding connection and a hopeful arc.*
5. *We Are Okay* by Nina LaCour  
*Features grief, independence, and redefining family.*
