As 2025 comes to an end, we celebrate a year of resilience and impact. Despite external pressures that continue to challenge our communities, NewPath Child & Family Solutions has remained steadfast in meeting the growing needs of those we serve. This year, we focused on improving access and strengthening services to ensure that every individual receives the care and support they deserve.

NewPath strived to bridge the gap between the needs of our clients and our service offerings. This commitment drove better client engagement for increased positive outcomes.

- Residential Interventions' footprint is increasing by 50% with an announced renovation and the construction of a new addition at our East campus.
- OhioRISE Care Coordination continued to grow, serving approximately 23% more youth this year than in the past.
- Independent Living Services had eight young people complete high school or obtain their GED this year.
- Day Treatment grew its program reach to 132 clients, supporting the future success of 53% more students.
- Foster Care had a 39% increase in placements to safe and loving homes, growing the number to 138 foster care youth.

In 2025, our impact continued to grow:

- **7,392 youth and family members impacted**
- **Over 121,069 individual services delivered**







Foster Care Story

Late last year, a single conversation set an incredible story into motion. Through a mutual connection, NewPath was introduced to Amber and Charles Weghorn — parents of two and deeply rooted members of their community. Charles, a firefighter, had recently responded to a call where three children were found in devastating circumstances. Even after his shift ended, their faces stayed with him, and he shared the weight of that moment with his wife, Amber.

The Weghorns couldn't stop thinking about the children — alone in the hospital, recovering, and facing an uncertain future. After many heartfelt conversations with their own children, they found themselves asking: If these kids need a home... could we be that home?

NewPath's foster care team explained the fostering process and the possibility of kinship care if approved by the county. What stood out was the Weghorns' readiness. They were willing to begin the process without knowing whether the children would even need placement — simply because it felt right.

Behind the scenes, NewPath connected with the county, and the response was clear: the children were in custody and would need a foster or kinship home. When officials learned that a firefighter who had helped rescue the children wanted to be considered for kinship, they approved the Weghorns — allowing the siblings to remain in their community, cared for by someone who had already shown up for them.

From there, Amber and Charles moved forward with unwavering commitment. With the support of their two biological children, they prepared their home, began the kinship process, and were granted permission to visit the children in the hospital during an incredibly fragile time.



A few weeks later, two siblings were discharged into their care. Soon after, the third joined them — reunited, safe, and welcomed into a family waiting with open arms.

The journey has not been easy. The children carry trauma and medical and emotional needs. The days are full of appointments, therapies, and the slow work of healing. But now, the children have stability, safety, and a family — including two biological children who chose to open their home and their hearts.

This is foster care at its best.

It looks like courage.

It looks like community.

It looks like choosing “yes” before knowing how hard it will be — and showing up anyway.

And it looks like NewPath walking beside families like the Weghorns, helping moments of heartbreak become stories of hope.

Donor Highlight: Honoring a Legacy of Love and Service

This year, NewPath Child & Family Solutions received a heartfelt gift that tells an incredible story of love, resilience, and impact across generations. Maurice Prather and his wife Beverly adopted Jeffrey Ross Prather from St. Joseph Orphanage (now NewPath) as an infant. Maurice dreamed of seeing Jeffrey play football in high school, but when that didn't spark Jeffrey's interest, Maurice introduced him to martial arts—a decision that would shape countless lives.

Jeffrey embraced martial arts and eventually became a teacher, founding dojos across the country. His mission goes far beyond physical training: many of his students, like Amber, have experienced trauma, and Jeffrey uses martial arts as a path to healing and empowerment.

Jeffrey's life of service didn't stop there. He served as a Major in the U.S. Army, then continued his work in the Drug Enforcement Administration and Defense Intelligence Agency. He trained tens of thousands of military personnel, developed self-defense programs for women and children, raised awareness about child trafficking, and founded Christ Connection Chaplaincy to support trauma recovery and outreach for vulnerable youth.

Recently, Maurice passed away. To honor his memory and the profound impact of his love, students from Jeffrey's dojos came together to make a gift to NewPath during the Cincy GIVES Challenge. Their donation—matched during the campaign—will help children in our care find safety, healing, and hope, just as Jeffrey did decades ago. The group plans to make this tribute an annual tradition.

Amber, one of Jeffrey's students, shared: *"Jeffrey Prather has touched and saved countless lives, including mine. This gift is given from the heart, in gratitude for the home St. Joseph (NewPath) provided when his birth mother lovingly entrusted him to your care. The correlation between Mr. Prather's work and NewPath's mission to rescue and heal children impacted by trauma stands out to all of us."* — Amber Coomes

This story shows how one act of love can ripple across generations, creating a legacy of hope and healing. We are proud to honor Maurice and Jeffrey's journey and grateful to those who continue to carry it forward. Together we are igniting hope and changing futures.

When Hannah walked through the doors of NewPath's residential campus on Christmas morning, she wasn't just bringing gifts—she was bringing understanding, compassion, and hope. Years ago, Hannah spent her own holidays in residential care. She knows what it feels like to wake up away from home on a day that's supposed to be filled with family and warmth.

That's why she came back—not as a client, but as a volunteer determined to make the season brighter for kids who are walking a path she once knew. Hannah spent the morning with the girls as they unwrapped their gifts, laughed, and shared stories. The connection was instant. The kids bonded with her quickly, sensing that she truly understood their experience.

For Hannah, this wasn't a one-time visit. She's committed to returning every Christmas morning and volunteering more throughout the year. We're helping her complete the certifications needed so she can spend even more time with the youth in our care.

Hannah's journey is a powerful reminder of what hope can do. She turned her own challenges into a mission to support others—and in doing so, she's changing futures.

Nourishing Hope, Learning to Grow

Melissa* first came to NewPath in 2019 after relocating to Ohio from Puerto Rico. She suffered from major depression, struggled to make friends, and frequented the hospital for self-injury recovery. Backed by the support of NewPath's team of professionals, Melissa graduated from high school a few months early, obtained her driver's license, and completed her phlebotomy certification. She now works full-time in healthcare and lives independently in an apartment with a roommate. Melissa used the tools and skills she learned from NewPath to achieve her goals, gain control of her life, and maintain a healthy mental well-being.

Feeling Safe Enough to Succeed

Daevion* experienced frequent hospitalizations due to threats of self-harm as a means to escape conflict at his group home. He felt alone, as if no one truly cared about him. Daevion was referred to NewPath through the hospital and started work with both the Therapy and Medication Management teams. NewPath provided him with the safety and care he needed to graduate high school, get a summer job, and attend Cincinnati State.






